Dogs Eligible to Enter

This trial is open to Papillons fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC limited registration, or Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP). Bitches in season, aggressive dogs, blind dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance are ineligible to participate.

Online Entry

The club is using the <http://www.R2AgilityOnline.com> website for online entry. It has two main options after you create an account and add your dog's information.

1. FOR FREE! –Create an entry, print and mail with a check. The website calculates correct fees and BEST OF ALL – no more handwriting issues and fewer mistakes! Be kind to your trial secretary and mail a 100% accurate legible entry!

2. Create an entry like above and then UP TO THE LAST MINUTE or immediately when it opens, click the payment button to pay with a credit card. You are then guaranteed entry into the show.

During the first 48 hours after opening, the club will accept 175 runs using the instant online process. The club reserves the right to decrease or increase the online entry availability as needed.

Refunds

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Event Committee. Refunds will not be issued for less than \$10; any overpayment less than \$10 will be considered a donation to the club.

Bitches in Season are not permitted to compete in agility trials. Any exhibitor with a bitch entered which is in season on the trial date will be refunded their entry fee upon written certification from a veterinarian. Notification with documentation from veterinarian must be in the hands of the Trial Secretary no later than 30 minutes before the start time of the trial.

Injured Dogs – Dogs that cannot compete prior to the set of trials due to an injury/illness will be refunded the entry fee, less \$5.00 per run, upon written certification from a veterinarian. Notification with documentation from veterinarian must be in the hands of the Trial Secretary no later than 30 minutes before the start time of the trial. Validation of the injury/illness must be made by a licensed veterinarian. Requests from chiropractors, massage/physical therapists, etc. will not be accepted. Handler illness/injury is excluded from this policy.

Catalogs

Electronic marked catalogs will be available upon request at the conclusion of the trial. Please notify the Trial Secretary in writing to request a copy.

Important Information for Exhibitors -- PLEASE READ!

Conditional, unsigned, incomplete, illegible, telephone, fax, e-mail or telegraph entries cannot be accepted. Entries not on official AKC forms, or photocopies of AKC

forms without the agreement and rules on the reverse side of the official AKC entry form, are not acceptable. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry.

Owners are responsible for errors on entry forms, for entering the same dog twice, or for entering a dog in a class for which it is not eligible, regardless of who makes such errors. Dogs wrongly entered in a class may not be transferred to another class after closing, EXCEPT as provided for in the Regulations for Agility Trials, Chapter 1, Section 21. Be sure to check your entry form carefully and make certain you have entered the correct class(es). Contact the Trial Secretary if you have questions.

Entries sent by express mailing services MUST have the delivery signature requirement waived, otherwise receipt may be delayed. Entries will not be considered as being received until they are delivered to the address given on the entry form. Please note the opening date of **March 28, 2025**; no entries will be accepted before that date. Entries for a maximum of ten (10) dogs are allowed in one envelope; envelopes containing entries for more than ten dogs will be considered invalid and will be returned to the sender. No hand delivered entries can be accepted until **Noon March 28, 2025**.

Entry fees will not be refunded in the event of errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date, or in the event a dog is absent (other than as specified on page 2), disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by the Show Committee. No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.

Confirmation of entry and judging schedule will be e-mailed (or sent by postal mail to the address on the official AKC entry form, if no e-mail is provided) after the closing date; if not received at least 7 days prior to the show, contact the Trial Secretary. Acknowledgment of receipt of entries prior to closing will be provided if the exhibitor provides a valid e-mail address on the entry form, or includes a stamped, self-addressed postcard with entry.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

4 Paws DogWorks, Papillon Club of America, and trial secretary assume no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or spectators, or to any of their dogs or property, and further assume no responsibility for injury to any child not under the control of his or her parents or guardians. It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Show Committee, be asked to leave the show site and no refund of

any fees paid will be made. All dogs must be on leash at all times except when in the ring or designated warm-up area.

The safety of dogs is of primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

Entering Regular & Preferred Jump Heights

Exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. For example, the same dog may now be entered in Regular FAST and/or T2B to finish up those titles while also entered in Preferred Master STD/JWW to start working towards their PACH at the lower height. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note that if a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then NO Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. The Double Q still requires that Standard Agility and Jumpers with Weaves be either both Regular OR both Preferred on the same trial day. Additionally, within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights [in different classes] within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day. A separate entry form must be submitted when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred classes and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend, thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend. [EXAMPLE: if you are entering a dog in some Regular classes and some Preferred classes, submit one entry form for the Regular classes, and another entry form for the Preferred classes.] When calculating entry fees, treat multiple entry forms for the same dog as if only one form had been filled out. In other words, the 1st run entry fee is only paid once per day, per dog, even if that dog's runs have been submitted on multiple entry forms.

Volunteers

Judging Assignments

Measuring and Jump Height Card Information

Handlers whose dogs measure into the 8" through 20" regular jump height divisions may opt to enter in a higher or 24-choice height division for all Regular titling classes, but not in a division lower than their proper height division. Dogs who measure into the 24" regular jump height division may not enter 24-choice. Dogs entered in the Preferred classes must compete at the required jump height and may not compete in a jump height division higher or lower than their proper height division.

All dogs that have not been officially measured for an Agility Jump Height Card may still compete; however, they must be measured by a Judge of record, an Agility Field Representative, or a Volunteer Measuring Official, prior to running. If measured by the Judge of record, that measurement will be valid for this trial or back-to-back trials only. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running.

On the entry form, please designate whether your dog has a valid jump height card or if your dog needs to be measured. Please check the appropriate box so that the Trial Secretary knows whether to include your dog on the Dogs to be Measured List. It is no longer required that you submit a copy of your dog's jump height card with your entry form or show it during the day-of-show check-in. However, it is the sole responsibility of the exhibitor to have their original, official jump height card or temporary jump height form at each trial to present upon request. Additionally, if a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running. Regulations for Agility Trials, Chapter 2, Section 4.

This judge is not a Volunteer Measuring Official. Dogs under 2 years of age with an official temporary measurement, dogs with a permanent height card, and dogs that have had at least one official measurement after age 2 by a VMO or AKC agility field representative do not need to be measured. All other dogs MUST be measured by the judge prior to running; this measurement only applies to this weekend's trials and does not count toward the dog's permanent height card.

Move Ups

Move-ups after entries close must be submitted in writing (e-mail OK) so that the Trial Secretary receives them by 6:00PM PST on **Monday May 12, 2025**. Reply to your confirmation and include the class you are moving from/to. Email to cerealwithdogs@gmail.com. If you do not receive an acknowledgement of your

move-up request, please contact the Trial Secretary to make sure that it was received. No phone move ups accepted.

Friday to Saturday and Saturday to Sunday move-ups will be accepted at the trial; they must be submitted in writing no later than 30 minutes after the trial is concluded each day.

For Exhibition Only (FEO)

For Exhibition Only will be allowed at these trials. FEO will allow exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. FEO is allowed in all classes. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.

FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show. Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day-of-show jump height changes are not allowed. Dogs may be entered at any level (Novice, Open, Excellent, or Masters) in FAST, JWW, Standard or Premier classes. If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day-of-show level changes are not allowed.

The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out to the scribe and the judge. The course time for FEO in Time 2 Beat, JWW, Standard, & Premier will be 45 seconds. FAST course times for each class/height are as noted in the Regulations.

Toys are allowed in the ring, food/treats are not allowed in the ring.

- Toys must be non-audible
- Toys may not leave the handler's hand
- Toys that roll freely cannot be used

Fix and Go On (FNG)

Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run. FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.

Obstacles

Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of AKC Regulations for Agility Trials.

Awards

Ribbons will be awarded for Qualifying scores and for first through fourth place in each height division in each class.

Regular Classes

First Place: Blue Third Place: Yellow
Second Place: Red Fourth Place: White
Qualifying Score: Dark Green

A qualifying score is required for all awards. All awards must be claimed at the show. Dogs completing any title will be offered a New Title rosette. Dogs earning a Double Q (Master Standard/Master Jumpers same day) will be offered a QQ rosette. All dogs completing a MACH or PACH at this trial will receive a MACH/PACH bar and rosette. Please inform the Trial Secretary before the trial if you are close. **Please note:** the club does not have Grand Champion ribbons or bars.

National High in Trial Awards: The awards below will be Embroidered Chair Back with pocket and Rosette

Regionals #1 and #2 High in Trial Awards: Training gear and Rosette

Scoring for Awards: Only Qualifying runs count towards awards. The High Scoring Dog in Trial in Master/Excellent Regular Classes will go to the dog earning a Double Q in Standard and Jumpers with Weaves with the highest combined YPS (yards per second) as determined by the agility trial secretary computer program. If there is no Double Q, the dog with the highest YPS will earn the award. In the case of a tie, the dog with the highest YPS from Standard will be the winner. In the event of a further tie, the winner will be determined by a coin toss.

High Scoring Dog in Trial in Open, Novice, or Preferred classes will go to the dog with the highest YPS in Standard or Jumpers with Weave, with tie breakers as noted above.

High Scoring Breed Champion will be the dog with the highest YPS determined in the following order: Master classes first, then Excellent, then Open, and then Novice with tie breakers as noted above. Any dog eligible for Highest Scoring Breed

Champion must sign up by 10:30 a.m. on Saturday (National) with the Trial Secretary.

The Regional awards will go to the dog with the highest YPS in Standard or Jumpers with Weaves with tie breakers as noted above.

Club reserves the right to make prize substitutions of equal or greater value in the event a specific prize listed is not available.

There will be a drawing for baskets/items. We are asking exhibitors to please donate individual prizes or prize baskets to the raffle. Phalène

High Scoring Phalène for Agility Trials shall be a Papillon Breed dog with both ears down when the dog is in a relaxed state (not in an alert state) looking straight ahead. For any questions regarding qualifications, prior to the event, the Phalène Committee Chair shall make the defining decision.

Furthest Traveled prize

To earn this prize, you must have dog entered; but no performance is required. To enter you must provide proof of your travel distance. Acceptable documentation includes worn vehicle tires (bicycle, car, motorcycle, RV, scooter, truck) or ticket from legitimate transport service (airline, balloon, bus, cruise ship, freighter, helicopter, river barge, ship, submarine, subway, taxi, train)

These agility trials will be held indoors on 1 inch EvoFoam mats in 1 100x100 ring. The building has modern restroom facilities. Crating will be available indoors, space is limited so please plan to use space efficiently. We ask that all dogs be securely contained without risk of getting loose; hard crates are not required but recommended for dogs at risk of getting out. We ask this for the safety of all dogs involved. A committee member has the right to consolidate crating as needed. Use of X-Pens will not be allowed.

Crates may be left overnight; however, the Papillon Club of America, 4 Paws DogWorks and its agents, employees, etc. will not be responsible for any lost or damaged items left at the show site.

Dispose of all pet waste OUTSIDE in the containers provided.

Dogs are not allowed to relieve themselves on any building or landscaping.

Anyone not cleaning up after their dogs will be removed from trial with no refunds.

- Exhibitors and Guests accept personal liability with respect to any claim made in respect to any damage or injury caused by their dogs or dogs in their possession.
- If it is necessary to rescue a dog from a parked car on the show grounds, the club will not be responsible or liable for any damage to the car involved.
- Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult at all times, when on the grounds.

Warm-Up Area And Jump

A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, may be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training or relieving the dog.
